Preparing for Holy Week

The Triduum, the three day celebration of the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of the Lord, includes Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil. The Masses or principal services of each day, are the preeminent way that we enter into the deepest mystery of Christian faith. Since neither Holy Thursday nor Good Friday are holy days of obligation, many Catholics have never experienced the richness of these days. Additionally, as the obligation is only to Sunday Mass, many Catholics will have never attended the Easter Vigil, the principal celebration of the Resurrection at which there are baptisms and the welcoming of new Catholics into the Church.

Additionally, we Dominicans bring our own special traditions to these three days, especially with the unique morning prayer services of "Tenebrae."

Many of our community have also been quite surprised in attending the special Masses and services of the Triduum, to experience the singing style our student community has developed over the years.

Truly these are the days in which our entire community is invited to come together to pray as one, not as four separate Mass communities, but as a parish community. In your own homes, in your personal prayer, take some time of silence this week to prepare for the upcoming solemnities. Together, may we enter into the Passion and Death of the Lord and so experience here, now, the outpouring of the mercy of the Cross and the life of the Resurrection.
